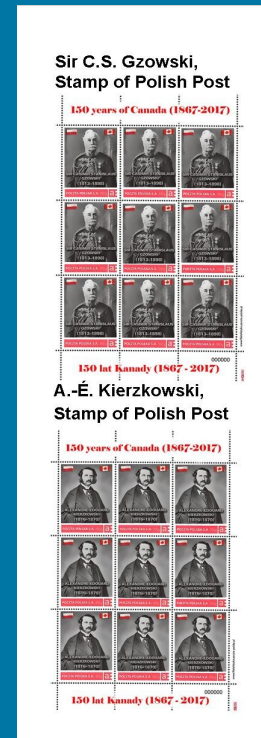
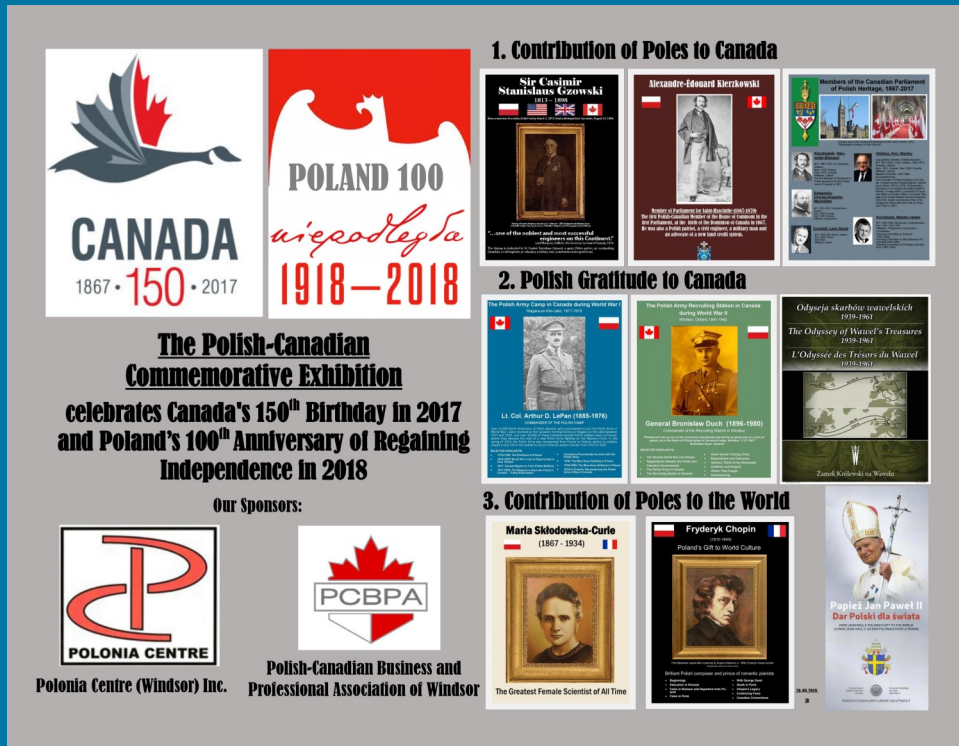

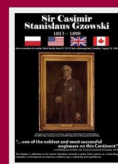

- Alexandre-Édouard Kierzkowski, the first Member of Parliament of Polish descent in the first Parliament of Canada in 1867.



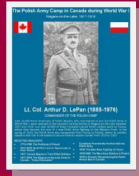
- Members of the Canadian Parliament of Polish Heritage, 1867-2017.



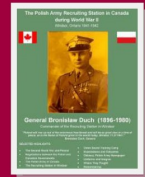
2. Polish Gratitude to Canada

Poland's contribution to the world is well known and extensively documented. Among the most widely recognized individuals are:

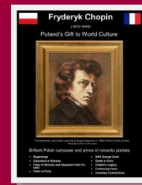
- Pope John Paul II, Poland's gift to the world.

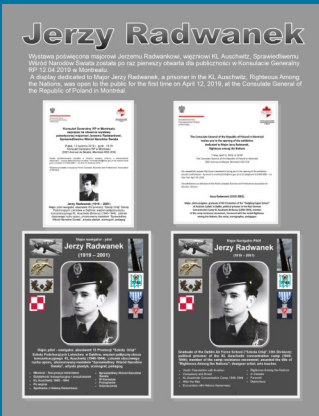

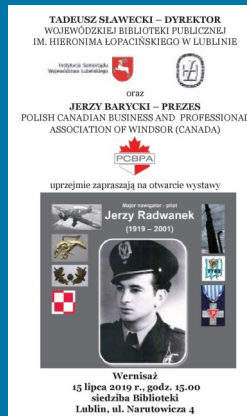
Major Jerzy Radwanek- political prisoner in KL Auschwitz (1940-1944)



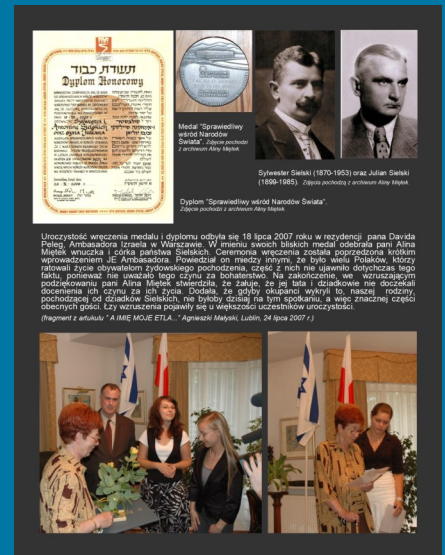
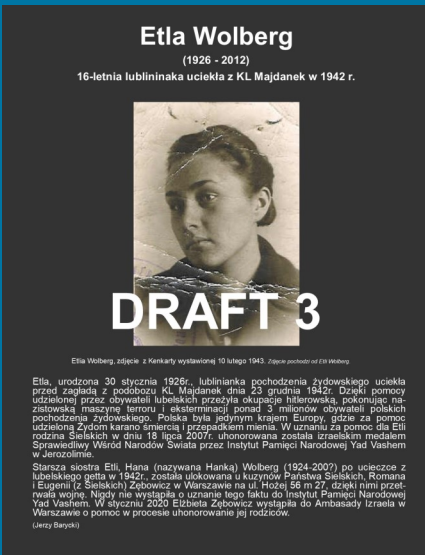

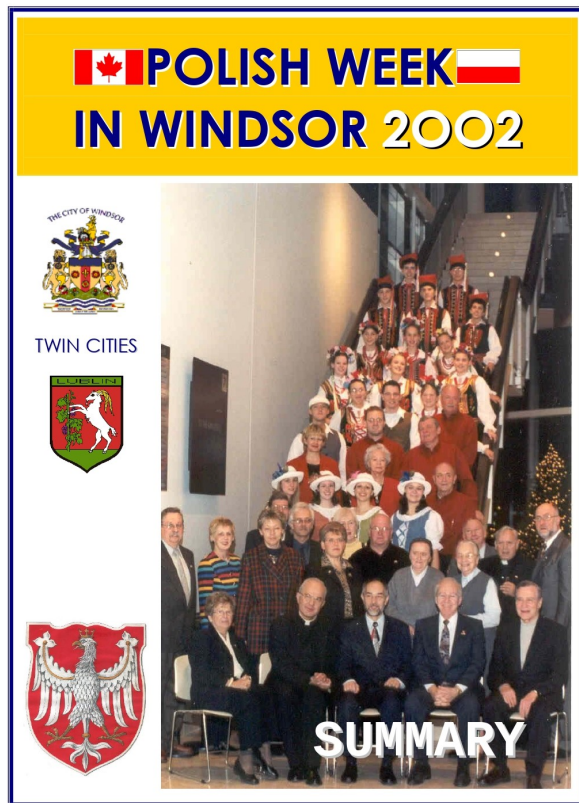

Young Polonia Day in Windsor, Part 2- Saturday, November 16

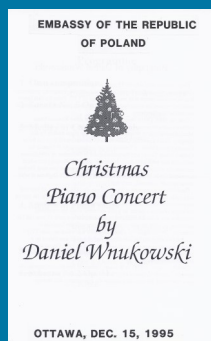

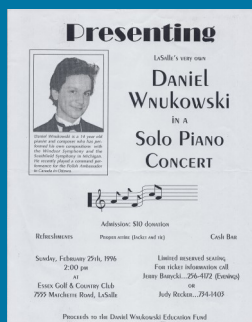
4.5 Daniel Wnukowski– Accomplished Pianist



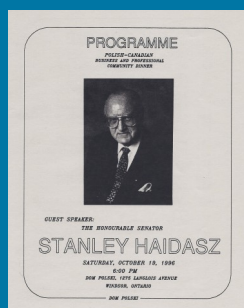
